Paper submission guidelines for Anglica Wratislaviensia

Advice for Authors — Anglica Wratislaviensia

- 1. Anglica Wratislaviensia welcomes submissions of articles, review articles, and reviews.
- 2. Articles should be between 4000 and 5000 words in length (including in-text citations, footnotes and references) unless otherwise agreed upon. Review articles should be up to 3000 words. Each article/review article should be preceded by an abstract of up to 200 words and 4–8 keywords. Reviews should be between 1000 and 1200 words (no abstract/keywords required).
- 3. Articles should be submitted to anglicawratislaviensia@gmail.com, together with a short bionote (ca. 100 words) including name, surname, affiliation, email address and postal address (postal address for editorial use only), and with a scan of a signed Statement of Originality (to be downloaded from the section of Documents for Downloading).
- 4. On the first page of the article, information about the Author should be placed in the upper left corner and include the following:
- Name and surname
- Affiliation: department or any other organizational unit
- University or any other academic organization and country
- Independent researchers should give the name of the sponsoring agency or the lab they have accessed, the country where the research has been conducted, the country of their residence.
 - 5. MLA style coupled with the requirements listed below should be used throughout the paper. A major failure to comply with this specification will cause an automatic rejection of the manuscript.
 - 6. The number of footnotes should be kept to a minimum. For citing sources, in-text citations should be used.
 - 7. Italics (and not underlining) should be used for titles of larger works, and double quotation marks for titles of shorter works.
 - 8. Punctuation, unless part of the quotation, should be placed outside quotation marks.
- 9. For terminology italics should be used (please do not underline).
- 10. British spelling conventions should be applied but with -ize endings instead of -ise (e.g., finalize, organize).

Submission to *Anglica Wratislaviensia* is open. Articles sent by November 15, if accepted for publication, are published the following year in the volume printed in autumn. Online version follows the printed one.

Peer review process & publishing procedures

- 1. Editorial Board reviews submissions for compliance with the profile of the journal and appoints reviewers. Editors may consult the Advisory Board on their decisions. Editors and any editorial staff of the journal treat received manuscripts for review as confidential documents and do not disclose any information about submitted manuscripts to anyone other than the corresponding author, reviewers, other editorial advisers, and the publisher. Manuscripts considered by the Editors to be inappropriate for *Anglica Wratislaviensia* may be declined without review. Editors of *Anglica Wratislaviensia* who submit their manuscripts for publication in the journal are subjected to the publishing procedures described above. The reviewers cannot have their work published in the same volume as the one containing the paper/s they have evaluated.
- 2. All articles, including review articles, are sent to two external reviewers, preferably one from Poland and one from abroad. Reviews are prepared in compliance with the requirements of the double-blind peer review model. Editorial assistants remove the authors' names and metadata. Reviews have a written form and use the English language. The review template includes a questionnaire as well as an open section where the reviewer may make further suggestions. The review is concluded with a clear statement of acceptance or rejection.
- 3. Conflicting opinions. If two conflicting opinions are issued by reviewers, the article is declined. However, its author may apply to the Board of Editors to have the article reviewed by a third referee. His/her opinion is decisive.
- 4. Articles accepted for publication are sent to the authors who introduce necessary changes. Any difference of opinion is resolved by the Editorial Board which is entitled to the final decision. The recommendations of reviewers are advisory to the Editors, who accept full responsibility for decisions about manuscripts. The author may be asked to write a reply to the reviewer's comments.
- 5. Revised manuscripts. When a revision is requested after peer review, the authors must return the revised manuscript promptly: 14 days is allotted for minor revisions of articles, 30 days for major revisions of articles. After the allotted time, a revised manuscript will be handled as a new submission and will be given a new receipt date.
- 6. Articles accepted for publication are sent to language editors and technical editors at the University Publisher's.
- 7. The list of reviewers is published on the periodical's homepage six months after publication.
